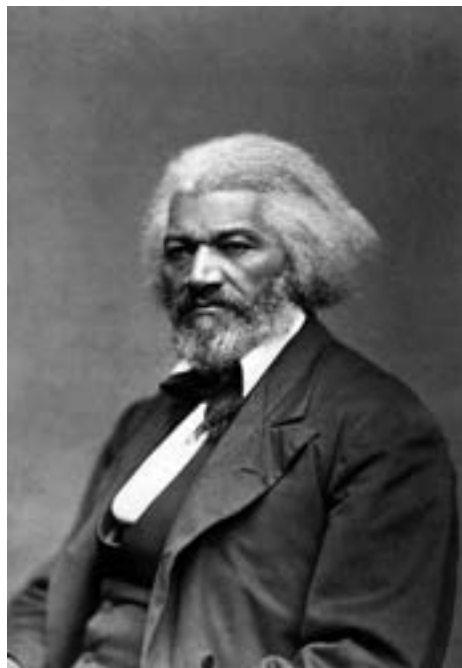


# Abolitionist Mini Project

For this project, you and your group are going to be assigned an abolitionist. You will have to create a comic on a piece of poster paper about that abolitionist as well as answer the following questions about them:

- **Biography Info:** Where were they from? How were they affected by slavery? What impacted them to join this movement?
- **Strategy for Abolition:** Include famous writings they made, speeches, events associated with this person, etc.
- **Impact on Slavery:** How were their strategies successful/unsuccessful? What legacy did they leave in the abolition movement?

Your comic strip should be at least 3 panels and should be about a strategy that they had for abolition or about an event that they participated in. The front of the poster should include the comic and the back should answer the above questions. You will also have to take notes on the presentations of your peers.
